**TEST YEAR 2024 GENERAL RATE CASE APPLICATION OF
SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA GAS COMPANY (U 904 G)**

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May 16, 2022

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Southern California Gas Company (SoCalGas or the Company) respectfully requests authority to update its Test Year 2024 (TY 2024) gas revenue requirement and base rates, effective January 1, 2024, and to implement a post-test year ratemaking mechanism for the remaining years of this four-year General Rate Case (GRC) cycle. Incorporated in this GRC filing is a TY 2024 cost of service study, pursuant to which SoCalGas’s rates should be set beginning January 1, 2024.¹

In this Application, SoCalGas (1) describes several of the key areas and activities the Company is focusing in this GRC and how they benefit ratepayers; (2) summarizes the relief it requests in this Application; (3) lists the exhibits SoCalGas is submitting in support of this Application; (4) summarizes its proposed post-test year ratemaking mechanism; (5) summarizes its regulatory accounts proposals and other issues; and (6) provides the information necessary to comply with the statutory and procedural requirements associated with this Application, including a recommended procedural schedule.

I. SUMMARY OF RELIEF REQUESTED

SoCalGas seeks to revise its authorized revenue requirement, effective on January 1, 2024, to recover the reasonable costs of SoCalGas’s gas operations, facilities, and infrastructure,

and other functions necessary to provide utility services to its customers. In general, SoCalGas has examined the specific changes expected to occur over the term of this GRC and proposes corresponding investments in, among other things:

- The Safe and Reliable Operation of Our Business: SoCalGas will continue to invest in its gas delivery system to maintain and enhance safety and reliability. SoCalGas is requesting revenue to invest in critical and mandated pipeline maintenance, including its Integrity Management Programs,² Pipeline Safety Enhancement Plan (PSEP),³ and a new Integrated Safety Enhancement Plan, which is designed to include certain PSEP work and also new amendments to 49 C.F.R. Parts 191, 192 by the Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration.⁴ SoCalGas is also requesting funding for its Facilities Integrity Management Program which will provide an integrated approach for enhancing the safety and integrity of facilities and associated equipment.⁵ SoCalGas will continue to prioritize safety and reliability, while taking steps to enhance its mitigation activities under the risk-informed GRC framework.⁶ In following this framework, SoCalGas has continued to evolve its risk and mitigation presentation, as shown through its May 2021 Risk Assessment Mitigation Phase Report, and its integration into this GRC.⁷
- Sustainability: Many of these anticipated expenses for safety and reliability and other requests throughout witness testimony are tied to SoCalGas's sustainability plans. Although sustainability has been a part of SoCalGas's business before this proceeding, in this GRC the Company is highlighting its role. As explained in the testimony of Naim Jonathan Peress and Michelle Sims (Exhibit (Ex.) SCG-2),

SoCalGas is committed to supporting and advancing the State’s climate policy goals, and has established five sustainability focus areas: (1) accelerating the transition to clean energy, (2) protecting the climate and improving air quality in our communities, (3) increasing clean energy access and affordability, (4) advancing a diverse, equitable, and inclusive culture, and (5) achieving world-class safety. These focus areas not only drive safety and reliability expenses, but also those tied to: the clean energy transition, where work is being done to determine how clean fuels can play a role in meeting the State’s climate goals;⁸ converting 50% of SoCalGas’s fleet to alternative-fuel vehicles, including battery electric, compressed natural gas using RNG, and hydrogen fuel cell electric vehicles;⁹ maintaining a flexible, reliable, and resilient energy system to help boost renewable energy penetration and decarbonize hard-to-abate sectors and help with affordability;¹⁰ and promoting diversity in the workforce and communities we serve.

- Promoting Innovation and Technology to Meet Operational and Customer Needs: In order to meet customer and business needs and also those presented by cybersecurity threats, SoCalGas needs to make investments in our Customer Information System (CIS) and cybersecurity protections. The Company also needs to update on-premises technology to have Cloud enablement and integration capabilities, as the technology industry continues to move toward Cloud-based solutions. On the gas operational side, SoCalGas is continuing to invest in its Control Center Modernization project, which will centralize and digitize the SoCalGas and SDG&E gas systems with the integration of data from over 9,800 new and existing field assets by the end of 2028, and enhance SoCalGas’s comprehensive view of the gas network.

- Developing our Workforce: SoCalGas will continue its strong commitment to investing in efforts and programs to maintain a highly-trained, qualified, and diverse workforce.

II. REQUEST AND RATE IMPACT

SoCalGas’s GRC Application requests that the California Public Utilities Commission (Commission or CPUC) authorize a \$4.426 billion revenue requirement, to be effective January 1, 2024. If approved, this revenue requirement would be an increase of \$767 million over the expected 2023 revenue requirement, or a 20.9% increase. When the impact of commodity costs and other ratemaking items such as regulatory account balances are included, these increases result in a 2024 system total bundled revenue increase of \$746 million (or 12.1%) over expected 2023 rates. If the 2024 revenue requirement identified above is approved by the Commission, an average non-CARE¹¹ residential customer (using 35 therms per month) can expect a bill increase of \$8.62 per month (or 13.7%), as compared to expected 2023 rates.

The proposed post-test year ratemaking mechanism would be used to set rates beginning January 1, 2025. Rates in 2026 and 2027 will be adjusted using the same mechanism (*see* Post-Test Year Ratemaking testimony of Khai Nguyen, Exhibit SCG-40).

SoCalGas files this Application concurrently with San Diego Gas & Electric Company’s (SDG&E) GRC filing, and will request consolidation of the proceedings initiated by these filings at the earliest possible opportunity, consistent with past practice and administrative efficiency.

WORKPAPERS

Witnesses who have workpapers supporting their testimony will have those workpapers offered into the evidentiary record. Workpapers will be numbered the same as each witness's testimony exhibit, but ending with "-WP" or, for capital workpapers, "-CWP." For example, O&M workpapers for SoCalGas witness Ms. Martinez (Gas Engineering) will be marked and offered as Ex. SCG-7-WP, and her capital workpapers will be marked as Ex. SCG-7-CWP.¹³

IV. SUMMARY OF THE POST-TEST YEAR RATEMAKING MECHANISM

As addressed in Mr. Nguyen's testimony (Ex. SCG-40), SoCalGas is proposing a post-test year ratemaking mechanism that will provide sufficient revenues to meet the challenges the Company expects to face beyond TY 2024. SoCalGas's post-test year proposal features: (1) a post-test year ratemaking mechanism to adjust authorized revenue requirements for operating and capital-related expenditures; (2) incorporation of certain post-test year capital exceptions; and (3) the continuation of the currently authorized Z-factor mechanism.

V. REGULATORY ACCOUNTS PROPOSALS

In the Regulatory Accounts testimony of Rae Marie Yu (Ex. SCG-38), SoCalGas proposes the following actions with respect to regulatory accounts:

- Amortize balances for 10 accounts that will remain open.¹⁴ These existing regulatory accounts have balances subject to disposition through the implementation of this GRC. Actual regulatory account balances as of December 31, 2023, as it pertains to costs reviewed in this GRC will be incorporated into the development of the adopted 2024 GRC rates if a TY 2024 GRC decision is issued

on or after January 1, 2024. In the event that a decision is issued before January 1, 2024, SoCalGas will incorporate a forecast of the ending balances of the accounts as of December 31, 2023, for inclusion in 2024 GRC rates.

- Close 10 accounts.¹⁵
- Continue seven accounts.¹⁶
- Modify one account.¹⁷
- Create five new accounts.¹⁸

VI. IMPLEMENTATION

This GRC Application will result in new rates, effective January 1, 2024. SoCalGas may seek authorization to establish a regulatory account or mechanism to record the difference between the rates currently in effect for gas service and the final rates adopted in this GRC. This regulatory account/mechanism would be effective January 1, 2024. Similar relief has been granted in SoCalGas's past GRCs as well as the GRCs of the other California investor-owned utilities.

Implementation of the post-test year ratemaking framework, as described in Mr. Nguyen's testimony (Ex. SCG-40), will require SoCalGas to file an advice letter each year specifying the

application of the post-test year formula and resulting rates to be effective January 1 of the following year.

VII. STATUTORY AND PROCEDURAL REQUIREMENTS

A. Rule 2.1 (a) – (c)

This Application is filed pursuant to P.U. Code Sections 451, 454, 491, 701, 728, 729, 740.4 and 795, the Commission’s Rules of Practice and Procedure and applicable prior Commission decisions, orders and resolutions.

In accordance with Rule 2.1 (a) – (c) of the Commission’s Rules of Practice and Procedure, SoCalGas provides the following information.

1. Rule 2.1 (a) - Legal Name

SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA GAS COMPANY is a public utility corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of California. SoCalGas owns natural gas transmission pipelines, compressor plants, distribution pipelines, services and appurtenant meters, regulators, metering and regulating stations, booster stations, general office buildings, regional and district office buildings, general shops, laboratory buildings, warehouses and other storage facilities, supplies and equipment necessary for the operation of its business. In addition, SoCalGas owns underground gas storage reservoirs, transmission and distribution pipelines and facilities used in the provision of safe and reliable gas delivery service to its customers. SoCalGas’s principal place of business is 555 West Fifth Street, Los Angeles, California, 90013.

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3. Rule 2.1 (c)

a. Proposed Category of Proceeding

In accordance with Rule 7.1, SoCalGas requests that this Application be categorized as ratesetting.

b. Issues to be Considered and Relevant Safety Considerations

The principal issues to be considered in this proceeding are as follows:

1. Whether SoCalGas's proposed TY 2024 revenue requirement is just and reasonable, and should be adopted by the Commission and reflected in rates;
2. Whether SoCalGas's proposed post-test year ratemaking mechanism is just and reasonable; and
3. Whether SoCalGas's regulatory accounts proposals are just and reasonable.

With respect to relevant safety considerations, the issues above will be considered within the context of the Commission's new risk-informed GRC framework, as discussed above. The focus on safety and risk mitigation and how RAMP was integrated into the GRC will be major components of this GRC proceeding.

c. Need for Hearings

SoCalGas anticipates that evidentiary hearings will be necessary.

d. Proposed Schedule

Pursuant to the GRC Application Filing Schedule, as modified by D.20-01-002, SoCalGas proposes the following schedule (dates included in D.20-01-002 noted with an asterisk):

SoCalGas also recommends that, consistent with past practice, the Commission consolidate SoCalGas’s Application with SDG&E’s Application and that the Commission adopt the same procedural schedule for both utilities. This is reasonable because SoCalGas and SDG&E file their respective Applications at the same time and share common witnesses. SoCalGas and SDG&E intend to file a motion shortly after filing this Application requesting consolidation of the proceedings.

B. Rule 2.2 – Articles of Incorporation

A copy of SoCalGas’s Restated Articles of Incorporation, as last amended, presently in effect and certified by the California Secretary of State, was previously filed with the Commission on October 1, 1998, in connection with Application (A.) 98-10-012, and is incorporated herein by reference.

C. Rule 3.2 (a) – (d) – Authority to Change Rates¹⁹

In accordance with Rule 3.2 (a) – (d) of the Commission’s Rules of Practice and Procedure, SoCalGas provides the following information.

1. Rule 3.2 (a) (1) – Balance Sheet

SoCalGas’s balance sheet, income statement, and financial statement for the twelve-month period ending December 31, 2021, are included with this Application as Appendix A.

2. Rule 3.2 (a) (2) – Statement of Effective Rates

A statement of all of SoCalGas’s presently effective gas rates can be viewed electronically on SoCalGas’s website. Appendix B to this Application provides the table of contents from SoCalGas’s tariffs on file with the Commission.

3. Rule 3.2 (a) (3) – Statement of Proposed Rate Change

A statement of proposed rate change is attached as Appendix C. Appendix C includes Tables 1 and 2 showing the allocation of SoCalGas’s gas revenues, by customer class, of proposed 2024 rates in comparison to as-expected authorized 2023 rates and present 2022 rates. This is further discussed in the Present and Proposed Gas Transportation Revenues & Rates testimony of Sharim Chaudhury (Exhibit SCG-46), which is being served concurrently with this Application.

4. Rule 3.2 (a) (4) – Description of Property and Equipment

A general description of SoCalGas’s property and equipment was previously filed with the Commission on May 3, 2004, in connection with SoCalGas’s Application 04-05-008, and is incorporated herein by reference. A statement of Original Cost and Depreciation Reserve for the twelve-month period ending December 31, 2021, is attached as Appendix D.

5. Rule 3.2 (a) (5) and (6) – Summary of Earnings

A summary of SoCalGas’s earnings for the twelve-month period ending December 31, 2021, is included as Appendix E to this Application.

6. Rule 3.2 (a) (7) – Statement Regarding Tax Depreciation

For financial statement purposes, depreciation of utility plant has been computed on a straight-line remaining life basis, at rates based on the estimated useful lives of plant properties. For federal income tax accrual purposes, SoCalGas generally computes depreciation using the

straight-line method for tax property additions prior to 1954, and liberalized depreciation, which includes Class Life and Asset Depreciation Range Systems, on tax property additions after 1954 and prior to 1981. For financial reporting and rate-fixing purposes, “flow through accounting” has been adopted for such properties. For tax property additions in years 1981 through 1986, SoCalGas has computed its tax depreciation using the Accelerated Cost Recovery System. For years after 1986, SoCalGas has computed its tax depreciation using the Modified Accelerated Cost Recovery Systems and, since 1982, has normalized the effects of the depreciation differences in accordance with the Economic Recovery Tax Act of 1981 and the Tax Reform Act of 1986.

7. Rule 3.2 (a) (8) – Proxy Statement

A copy of the most recent proxy statement, dated April 26, 2022, was mailed to the Commission on April 27, 2022, and is incorporated herein by reference.

8. Rule 3.2 (a) (10) – Statement Regarding Pass Through to Customers

This GRC Application will seek the Commission’s authorization to revise SoCalGas’s current base rate revenue requirement to recover its projected costs of its operations, as well as owning and operating its natural gas facilities and infrastructure, for the purposes of serving its customers. It is not only a pass through of costs.

9. Rule 3.2 (b) – Notice to State, Cities, and Counties

In compliance with Rule 3.2 (b) of the Commission’s Rules of Practice and Procedure, SoCalGas will, within 20 days after the filing this Application, mail a notice to the State of California and to the cities and counties in its service territory including those listed in Appendix F to this Application.

10. Rule 3.2 (c) – Newspaper Publication

In compliance with Rule 3.2 (c) of the Commission’s Rules of Practice and Procedure, SoCalGas will, within 20 days after the filing of this Application, publish in newspapers of general circulation in each county in its service territory notice of this Application.

11. Rule 3.2 (d) – Bill Insert Notice

In compliance with Rule 3.2 (d) of the Commission’s Rules of Practice and Procedure, SoCalGas will, within 45 days after the filing of this Application, provide notice of this Application to all of its customers along with the regular bills sent to those customers that will generally describe the proposed rate changes addressed in this Application.

Accordingly, SoCalGas will serve this Application, including its appendices, accompanying prepared direct testimony and related exhibits, on parties to the service lists for the consolidated 2019 GRC proceeding for SDG&E and SoCalGas (A.17-10-007/008 (cons.)) and the SDG&E/SoCalGas RAMP proceeding (A.21-05-011/014 (cons.)). A copy of these service lists is attached to this Application as Appendix G. Pursuant to the Rate Case Plan and requests, SoCalGas will send via overnight mail two hard copies to Chief Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) Anne E. Simon and three hard copies to the California Public Advocates Office. Under Commission Rule 1.10(e), service will be accomplished by providing a link to the published documents located on SoCalGas's website at: <https://www.socalgas.com/regulatory/2024-general-rate-case>.

X. CONCLUSION

For all the foregoing reasons, SoCalGas respectfully requests that the Commission:

1. Consider this Application and grant all the relief requested herein;
2. Issue an Order authorizing SoCalGas to make such changes to its tariffs as are consistent with the relief requested herein; and
3. Grant such other and further relief as the Commission finds to be just and reasonable.
